

Speaker Pelosi’s Government Takeover of Health Care Will Hurt Seniors

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Health care reform should preserve choice and options for all seniors to ensure continued access to quality care that best suits their needs, and should reduce the cost of health care for all Americans. A Washington takeover of health care will achieve neither of these goals.

Instead, the 1,990-page takeover of health care being proposed by House Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) will eliminate choices, reduce benefits and raise premiums for America’s seniors. It makes deep cuts to Medicare, including cuts to Medicare Advantage plans, which will force millions of seniors out of their current coverage, breaking President Obama’s “if you like your health coverage, you can keep it” promise. And other changes to the Medicare prescription drug program will raise seniors’ premiums by as much as 20 percent.

As an alternative to the government takeover of health care proposed by Speaker Pelosi, House Republicans are offering a common-sense, responsible solution our nation and seniors can afford. The [GOP alternative](#) recognizes health care reform must preserve choices and benefits in Medicare that seniors depend on, and preserves the relationship between doctors and patients.

A Tale of Two Approaches:

	Pelosi Plan	GOP Alternative
Cuts to Medicare?	YES. CBO estimates the bill would cut Medicare by \$500 billion over the next ten years, and that Medicare cuts in the bill “will increase by 10 to 15 percent per year in the next decade.”	NO. Medicare is not cut.

Medicare Advantage is not cut, and benefits will not be limited or reduced.
Seniors Forced Out of Current Coverage They Like?	YES. Today, nearly 11 million seniors nationwide choose Medicare Advantage (MA) plans as the coverage that best meet their needs. An earlier analysis by Republicans on the House Ways & Means Committee found that 6 million seniors will be denied access to an affordable MA plan, including 3 million	NO. Seniors will be able to keep their current Medicare – including Medicare Advantage – plan if they like it.

Premium Increases for Seniors?	YES. Changes to the Medicare Part D prescription drug benefit will, according to earlier estimates by CBO , raise Medicare Part B premiums by \$25 billion and Part D premiums by 20 percent.	NO. There are no changes to Medicare that will increase premiums for seniors.

Pelosi Plan is Chock-Full of Bad News for Seniors:

- The nonpartisan experts at the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) recently released an [analysis](#) showing that the policies embodied by Speaker Pelosi’s health care bill could harm seniors’ medical care. Among the estimates released by CMS’ Office of the Actuary were:
 - Fewer doctors and hospitals treating Medicare patients: “Providers for whom Medicare constitutes a substantive portion of their business could find it difficult to remain profitable and might end their participation in the program (possibly jeopardizing access to care for beneficiaries).”
 - Medicare benefits will be cut for 11 million seniors: Medicare Advantage (MA) cuts would result in “less generous benefit packages. ...Under current law, MA plans use rebate revenues to reduce Medicare coinsurance requirements, add extra benefits such as vision or dental care, and/or reduce enrollee premiums for Part B or Part D of Medicare.”
 - Millions of seniors will lose their health plan: As a result of the Democrats' Medicare cuts, OACT predicts that enrollment in MA will decline from 13.2 million in 2014 to just 4.7 million, a 64 percent decline in projected enrollment. This also means that millions of seniors will lose the health plan that they have today.
- The nonpartisan Congressional Budget Office (CBO) arrived at similar conclusions. In their report, [CBO estimated](#) that Medicare cuts contained in the Democrats’ health bills, “could lead many plans to limit the benefits they offer, raise their premiums, or withdraw from the program.”
- Under Speaker Pelosi’s health care bill, the vast majority of Medicare beneficiaries will pay higher Part B (doctor visits) and Part D (prescription drug coverage) premiums. According to an earlier estimate by CBO, changes to the Medicare Part D program in the Pelosi plan would cause Part B premiums to increase by \$25 billion and Part D premiums to jump 20 percent.
