Dear Administrator Tavenner:

I am writing to formally request that CMS immediately make available to the Committee all information to date regarding the number of individuals who have successfully enrolled in the new Exchanges. As you know, CBS News has reported that this information does exist, and in fact, notes from the CCIIO War room show that "QSSI has a daily dashboard created every night."

We are facing a crisis. The failed launch of the Exchanges combined with the millions of cancellation notices is putting Americans health care coverage at risk. By all media accounts, enrollment in the Exchanges is thus far significantly behind the Administration's projections – and in those projections you anticipated a slow start. In other words, enrollment is in serious trouble.

The Committee is not prepared to wait until "around mid-November" for the Administration's scrubbed and spun numbers. Enrollment data exists today that will help this Committee begin to address the implications of the failed launch. Committee Members need to know the challenges CMS is facing – we need to know what you know.


As you recall, at the October 29 Ways and Means Committee hearing, I asked you if you could tell me how many people had enrolled and you responded, "We will not know that until mid-November." I asked if your staff had updated you on enrollment figures and your response was, "Chairman Camp, we will have those numbers available mid-November." Clearly, CMS has and can provide the Committee with this data. I am

severely disappointed by your lack of transparency before the Committee, and further hearings may be required to bring a full and accurate picture to light.

As you are aware, CMS is already providing enrollment information to the Department of Health and Human Services and the White House. If the updates are good enough for Secretary Sebelius and other Administration officials, the information is good enough for the Committee of jurisdiction. I request you produce the following:

- All enrollment data to date by close of business today; and
- Each day's enrollment data no later than 5:00 p.m. the following business day beginning immediately.

A refusal to comply with these requests will be met with subpoenas to compel their production.
