Dear Chairman Camp:

On behalf of the Hexcel Corporation, I am writing to express strong opposition to HR 5162, a miscellaneous tariff bill (MTB) that would temporarily suspend duties on certain acrylic fiber tow.

Hexcel is a major domestic manufacturer of specialty materials and composites that are made from carbon fibers. We are vertically integrated in that that our U.S. facilities produce the essential acrylic precursor that we further process into various finished carbon fiber products.

The specific product covered by HR 5162 would compete directly with items that we produce at our manufacturing facility in Decatur, Alabama. For this reason, we would object to adoption of HR 5162 as a standalone bill or to its inclusion in any larger MTB package compiled by Congress.
