B. Does the tariff relief specified in this Miscellaneous Tariff Bill benefit downstream producers, manufacturers, purchasers, and consumers?

Yes, the tariff relief benefits downstream producers, manufacturers, purchasers and consumers, as well as the employees and suppliers involved in manufacturing products using the fibers requested for tariff relief by reducing the cost of production.

Textile manufacturers in Canada, Europe, China and most other major textile-producing countries currently do not incur tariffs on acrylic fiber – either because there is an adequate domestic supply of the fiber or because tariffs on imports have been eliminated. Imposing a tariff on U.S. acrylic fiber imports would create a significant competitive disadvantage for U.S. manufacturers and likely force them to explore alternative options for manufacturing products that utilize acrylic fibers.
