Re: Change of Position on H.R. 4534

Dear Chairman Camp and Ranking Member Levin

First, please allow me to say thank you to you and your committee for pushing ahead with the MTB process in this Congress. In speaking with my representative and senators, there seems to be resistance to this process among other members of both houses. Your efforts in making this process completely open, transparent and above board are to be commended. The case of this bill, H.R. 4534 is a case where I believe that the process has worked as intended. I want to communicate that to you and to the Ways and Means Committee.

During the public comment period, I wrote in opposition to H.R. 4534, "To extend the temporary suspension of duty on biaxially oriented polypropylene film." My opposition on behalf of our company was conditional based on the language of the bill, and I tried to communicate that to the committee as well as to the U.S.I.T.C and the U.S. Department of Commerce during the vetting process.


During the vetting process, the Department of Commerce worked with me as well as the proponent company to find language that would benefit the proponent but also protect our interests. I received confirmation of the agreement by the proponent to new language describing the material in H.R. 4534 as follows:

"Biaxially oriented polypropylene film, certified by the importer as intended for metallization and use in capacitors, or certified by the importer as below 40 gauge (10.2 micrometers), not intended for metallization and intended for use in capacitors, all of the foregoing produced from solvent-washed low ash content (less than 50 ppm) polymer resin (CAS No. 9003-07-0) (provided for in subheading 3920.20.00)."

With H.R. 4534 worded as shown above, in agreement with the technical correction from House passed version of H.R. 6517 from the 111th Congress, we no longer object to this bill. I can now change my position from oppose to support. I encourage its inclusion in the forthcoming MTB.

Thank you for your consideration. And again, thank you to you and your staff for making the process work.
