RE: NCTO Opposition to H.R. 5497 and S.2477 - Withdrawal Letter

Dear Chairmen Camp and Baucus:

In our letter dated June 20, 2012, the National Council of Textile Organizations (NCTO) stated its opposition to H.R. 5497 and S. 2477, a proposed suspension of duty relating to certain warp knit, open-work fabric.

Following extensive consultation with the bill proponent and our member companies, we have determined that the product described below is not manufactured in the United States by our members. So long as H.R. 5497 and S. 2477 is amended with the below description, NCTO agrees to withdraw its opposition.

***Open-work warp knit fabrics (including those made on galloon knitting machines), other than those of headings 6001 to 6004, of synthetic fibers, unbleached or bleached, whose structure has bridging yarn structures in the fabric, for which origin and end of each individual bridging yarn are located on different chain yarns oriented in machine direction of the fabric.***
