RE: Opposition to H.R. 3926


Dear Chairman Camp and Ranking Member Levin:

The American Manufacturing Trade Action Coalition (AMTAC) represents U.S. manufacturers of various types of textile and apparel products. We are writing to strongly oppose H.R. 3926, a bill to suspend temporarily the duty on other knitted or crocheted fabrics, of cotton, dyed, other, of single knit construction (provided for in subheading 6006.22.90).

We are opposed to this bill because it grants duty relief to products that are made here in the United States. Milliken & Company, headquartered in Spartanburg, SC, produces cotton knit fabric meeting the description in H.R. 3926. An elimination of duty on imports of this cotton knit fabric would negatively impact their current and future business plans.

Again, thank you for the opportunity to comment on H.R. 3926. We greatly appreciate your noting our opposition to this bill.
