Dear Chairman Camp:

On behalf of the Celanese Corporation, I am writing to express strong support for the miscellaneous tariff bill (MTB) process in general, and to inform you of our specific support for HR 5309.

Celanese is a major domestic manufacturer of specialty materials and chemical products that employs more than 3,200 workers in eight states. Celanese is often forced to import certain chemicals and resins as inputs for further processing that simply are not available from U.S. suppliers. As such, we depend on the MTB to help eliminate or reduce duties on a limited number of items that we must import and that do not compete with any other domestic producer. The MTB process allows us to reduce our production costs and helps our U.S. manufacturing facilities to remain globally competitive.

HR 5309 would extend a current duty reduction on Para Hydroxybenzoic Acid, also known as PHBA. PHBA is a raw material used in the production of liquid polymers that have applications such as optical fiber connectors and needle free medical syringes.

Noting that there are no domestic producers of PHBA, Celanese will most certainly confront production cost increases if Congress fails to extend the existing MTB on this input. This in turn will hamper our domestic operations and threaten the U.S. jobs of our employees that are involved in the processing of PHBA. As a result, we greatly appreciate your efforts to secure passage of an MTB package prior to the end of this year.

Thank you for your consideration of our views in this matter and please let me know if you have any specific questions related to our support of HR 5309.
