Dear Acting Secretary Wolin and Acting Commissioner Miller:

Over the past six months, the Committee on Ways and Means and the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform have sought information related to the Treasury Department and Internal Revenue Service proposed rule<sup>1</sup> and final rule<sup>2</sup> regarding the health insurance premium tax credits contained in the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.<sup>3</sup> The Committees have also sought regulatory and legal analysis pertaining to the rule. In a series of letters on August 20, 2012,<sup>4</sup> October 18, 2012,<sup>5</sup> and December 13, 2012,<sup>6</sup> the Committees requested:

1. All legal analysis, internal or external, conducted by the IRS which authorizes IRS to grant premium-assistance tax credits in federal Exchanges; and
2. All documents and communications between IRS employees and employees of the White House Executive Office of the President or any other federal agency or department referring or relating to the [IRS rule].

In September, during a Ways and Means Subcommittee on Oversight hearing, then-Deputy Commissioner Steve Miller agreed to provide all documents “relating to the determination that the insurance premium subsidies apply to... federally created exchanges.”<sup>7</sup>

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More than seven weeks after the initial request, on October 12, 2012, Treasury responded to the letter and provided some documents. However, Treasury's production failed to include a single document or communication generated before the publication of the proposed rule on August 17, 2011, or any other substantive, non-public communication or document related to the rule or the issue of whether the tax credits would be authorized in federal exchanges. After a follow-up letter on October 18, 2012, from the Committee on Oversight and Government failed to produce additional cooperation from Treasury, Treasury officials met with staff from both Committees on November 2, 2012, to discuss the rule's development and to discuss Treasury's response to the Committees' requests.

Treasury officials offered to make certain internal memos available for *in camera* review. As an accommodation to Treasury, the Committees' agreed to Treasury's request to redact non-responsive material since Treasury officials communicated that would be the quickest way for the Committees to begin a review of the material. However, several portions of these documents were heavily redacted, including sections titled "Significant Issues and Considerations." The Department has even refused to allow Committee staff to review the entire memos without redactions in another *in camera* review in order to verify Treasury's assertions that the redacted sections of the memorandums are immaterial to Committee oversight interests. Regardless, since the redacted material undoubtedly relates to Treasury's regulatory analysis and constitutes documents and communications relating to the IRS rule, it must be turned over to the Committees.

Our staffs have attempted to work with Treasury in a cooperative manner regarding our request and they have tried repeatedly to accommodate Treasury's concerns about producing the documents, but Treasury refuses to be forthcoming with the Committees. We write today to ask that you produce the unredacted versions of all the documents reviewed thus far by our staffs within one week. Failure to comply with this request by February 5, 2013, will force the Committees to consider the use of compulsory process. We also write for an update on the status of the Committees' request for "all documents and communications between IRS employees and employees of the White House, Executive Office of the President or any other federal agency or department referring or relating to the proposed IRS rule or the final IRS rule" since we initially requested this information on August 20, 2012.

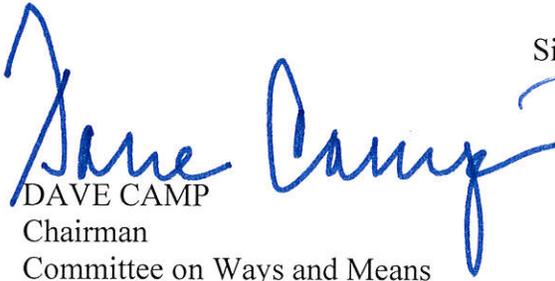
