Dear Chairman Emeritus Dingell, Congressman Pallone, Chairman Rangel, Congressman Stark, Congresswoman Titus, and Chairman Waxman:

I am writing to express the National Association of State Medicaid Directors (NASMD) strong support of H.R. 3631 the "Medicare Premium Fairness Act." This bill would protect all state Medicaid programs from paying disproportionately high Medicare Part B premiums for dual eligibles and people with disabilities. In addition to protecting the state Medicaid programs this important legislation will protect the Medicare beneficiaries who will see their Medicare Part B premiums increase even though they will not receive an adjustment in their Social Security benefits for 2010. Many of these beneficiaries are low income dual eligibles and they cannot afford these premium increases. Thus, we fully support this bill as it would extend the hold harmless policy to include all Medicare beneficiaries.
