AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H.R. 6084 Offered by Mr. Brady of Texas

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Improving Social Secu-3 rity's Service to Victims of Identity Theft Act".

4 SEC. 2. SINGLE POINT OF CONTACT FOR IDENTITY THEFT
5 VICTIMS.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Title VII of the Social Security
7 Act (42 U.S.C. 901 et seq.) is amended by adding at the
8 end the following:

9 "SECTION 714. SINGLE POINT OF CONTACT FOR IDENTITY 10 THEFT VICTIMS.

11 "(a) IN GENERAL.—The Commissioner of Social Se-12 curity shall establish and implement procedures to ensure 13 that any individual whose social security account number 14 has been misused (such as to fraudulently obtain benefits 15 under title II, VIII, or XVI of this Act, in a manner that 16 affects an individual's records at the Social Security Ad-17 ministration, or in a manner that prompts the individual 18 to request a new social security account number) has a $\mathbf{2}$

single point of contact at the Social Security Administra tion throughout the resolution of the individual's case. The
 single point of contact shall track the individual's case to
 completion and coordinate with other units to resolve
 issues as quickly as possible.

- 6 "(b) SINGLE POINT OF CONTACT.—
- 7 "(1) IN GENERAL.—For purposes of subsection 8 (a), the single point of contact shall consist of a 9 team or subset of specially trained employees who— 10 "(A) have the ability to coordinate with 11 other units to resolve the issues involved in the 12 individual's case, and 13 "(B) shall be accountable for the case until 14 its resolution. 15 "(2) TEAM OR SUBSET.—The employees in-16 cluded within the team or subset described in para-17 graph (1) may change as required to meet the needs
- 18 of the Social Security Administration, provided that19 procedures have been established to—
- 20 "(A) ensure continuity of records and case
 21 history, and
 22 "(B) notify the individual when appro-
- 22 (B) notify the individual when a23 priate.".

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
 subsection (a) shall take effect 180 days after the date
 of enactment of this Act.
