Dear Chairman Neal and Chairman Pascrell,

We write to urge you to schedule an oversight hearing as soon as possible regarding the illegal breach of taxpayer privacy stemming from the confidential taxpayer information that was leaked to the media outlet, ProPublica, and subsequently made public.<sup>1</sup> The series of articles published by ProPublica on June 8, 2021, claim that this "vast trove" of tax data came from the Internal Revenue Services (IRS). ProPublica continues to publish articles containing this illegally obtained data and after three months we have received no indication from the IRS, the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration, or the Department of Justice as to the source of the leaks. This is unacceptable.

The Ways and Means Committee, and the Oversight Subcommittee in particular, have long taken pride to protect taxpayer information under 26 U.S.C. § 6103. This work has been bipartisan. But in the last three months Committee Democrats have seemed largely uninterested in this issue, instead pursuing legislation to give approximately \$80 billion dollars to the IRS and to expand the agency's authority to collect the private bank account information of nearly every American. How can any Member of Congress pursue such policies without knowing whether the IRS has identified and resolved the security lapse that led to this massive leak of taxpayer data?
