

## Key Individual Tax Policies from the Trump Tax Cuts Set to Expire for Massachusetts Constituents

Tax Hikes Looming for Massachusetts Residents on December 31, 2025:

- Massachusetts is home to 4,624,080 taxpayers.
- The average taxpayer in Massachusetts would see a
  20% tax hike if the Trump Tax Cuts expire.
- A family of 4 making \$99,858, the median income in Massachusetts, would see a



**\$2,272** tax increase if the Trump Tax Cuts expire.

This is worth about **11 weeks of groceries** to a typical family of 4 in the region.

Impact on Massachusetts Residents by the Numbers		
802,540	Massachusetts families would see their household's Child Tax Credit cut in half.	
87%	of Massachusetts taxpayers would see their Guaranteed Deduction slashed in half.	
611,440	Small Businesses in Massachusetts would be hit with a 43.4% tax rate if the 199A Small Business Deduction expires.	
280,964	Massachusetts taxpayers would be impacted by the return of the Alternative Minimum Tax.	
6,516	Family-Owned Farms in Massachusetts would have their Death Tax Exemption slashed in half next year.
