

Key Individual Tax Policies from the Trump Tax Cuts Set to Expire for Oklahoma Constituents

Tax Hikes Looming for Oklahoma Residents on December 31, 2025:

- Oklahoma is home to **2,302,990** taxpayers.
- The average taxpayer in Oklahoma would see a 24% tax hike if the Trump Tax Cuts expire.
- A family of 4 making \$62,138, the median income in Oklahoma, would see a \$1,141 tax increase if the Trump Tax Cuts expire.



 This is worth about 6 weeks of groceries to a typical family of 4 in the region.

Impact on Oklahoma Residents by the Numbers		
450,960	Oklahoma families would see their household's Child Tax Credit cut in half.	
93%	of Oklahoma taxpayers would see their Guaranteed Deduction slashed in half.	
210,330	Small Businesses in Oklahoma would be hit with a 43.4% tax rate if the 199A Small Business Deduction expires.	
39,663	Oklahoma taxpayers would be impacted by the return of the Alternative Minimum Tax.	
68,267	Family-Owned Farms in Oklahoma would have their Death Tax Exemption slashed in half next year.
