

Key Individual Tax Policies from the Trump Tax Cuts Set to Expire for Vermont Constituents

Tax Hikes Looming for Vermont Residents on December 31, 2025:

- Vermont is home to **449,250** taxpayers.
- The average taxpayer in Vermont would see a **22% tax hike** if the Trump Tax Cuts expire.
- A **family of 4** making \$81,211, the median income in Vermont, would see a \$**1,713** tax increase if the Trump Tax Cuts expire.
 - This is worth about 8 weeks of groceries to a typical family of 4 in the region.



Impact on Vermont Residents by the Numbers		
67,560	Vermont families would see their household's Child Tax Credit cut in half.	
94%	of Vermont taxpayers would see their Guaranteed Deduction slashed in half.	
58,020	Small Businesses in Vermont would be hit with a 43.4% tax rate if the 199A Small Business Deduction expires.	
12,811	Vermont taxpayers would be impacted by the return of the Alternative Minimum Tax.	
6,145	Family-Owned Farms in Vermont would have their Death Tax Exemption slashed in half next year.
